

2022 National Book Festival Returns to DC

The National Book Festival returns to a live audience this year for a day of free talks and activities about books and authors to be held at the Walter E. Washington Convention Center on Saturday, Sept. 3. Featured authors include Mitch Albom, Geraldine Brooks, Marc Brown, Nyle DiMarco, Janelle Monae, Nick Offerman, Andrea Davis Pinkney, and Jason Reynolds.

This year's theme is "Books Bring Us Together," reflected in the event's official poster designed by artist, writer and educator Gail Anderson. Among its many panels and other programs, the festival will also feature the Roadmap to Reading, an giant space on the exhibition floor of the Convention Center where representatives from the Library's Center for the Book gather during the event, at their state's or territory's table to promote their unique literary heritage to the thousands of families that come each year.

A selection of programs will be livestreamed online and videos of all programs will be available shortly after the Festival. The event runs from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. (doors open at 8:30 a.m.). The event is free and open to the public. Belly Up to DC's Oldest Saloon

Called the oldest saloon in Washington, D.C., some of its many patrons and guests over the years are icons of American history.

According to the restaurant's website, the Old Ebbitt Grill was founded in 1856 as a boarding house by William E. Ebbitt, although its original location is unknown.
